# DR GREGORY OHLRICH

## NEUROLOGIST

Dr Greg Ohlrich gained his Medical Degree from the University of Queensland in 1963. He undertook his neurology training in Brisbane and in the United Kingdom, becoming a Member of the Royal Australian College of Physicians in 1968 and a Member of the Royal College of Physicians (UK) in 1970.

Dr Ohlrich was awarded the degree of DR of Medicine by the University of Queensland in 1974 for research work carried out in London (UK), this included developing a technique for isolating single nerve fibres in the cat spinal cord. Isolating single nerve fibres in the spinal cord had not been done satisfactorily before. This technique was then used to study an experimental demyelinating lesion, a model for multiple sclerosis

Dr Ohlrich subsequently became a Fellow of the Royal Australian College of Physicians in 1974 and a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians (UK) in 1993). He is registered in Queensland as a neurologist. He is currently an Independent Medical Assessor in Neurology and a Deputy Chairperson for the Neurology and Neurosurgery Assessment Tribunal Q-Comp.

Dr Ohlrich has previously held the position of Visiting Neurologist to the Royal Brisbane Hospital and a Consultant Neurologist in private practice in Brisbane. Additionally, he has been a Lecturer & Research Consultant for the Department of Medicine at the University of Queensland and the Chairman of the Department of Neurology & Neurosurgery at the Royal Brisbane Hospital.

Dr Ohlrich is trained in assessment of Permanent impairment using AMA4, AMA5 and AMA6 guides. He has a particular interest in **medico-legal and worker's compensation** aspects of neurology, including disorders of the spine, whiplash and head injuries.
